From the Principal

Dear Parents, Staff, Students and Friends,

We welcome our new students, staff and families to St Patrick's Marist College. This year we celebrate 200 years of Marist Education. We have had a wonderful start to 2017. There is such a positive energy both within and outside the classrooms. The move to a 5 period day with the two half hour breaks has been very smooth. I congratulate our new Year Sevens who have had a very successful start to the year.

This week we gathered to recognise and congratulate our 2016 High Achievers. What wonderful graduates who exemplify what it means to be a Marist. As I look at these students, I don't just see a HSC result. I see a group of young people who took the opportunity to be part of the full experience of St Patrick's Marist College. Through cultural pursuits, in sport, through their service to the community and many took roles as leaders both formally and informally in the School.

While honouring these individuals we also recognise the outstanding success of the whole cohort. With 60% Band 5 and 6s, and 89% in the top 3 bands of all individual subjects undertaken, 89% of our subjects above state average and 59% of students with an ATAR over 80.

Importantly, I want to acknowledge all of the students that performed well above what was expected. They are the silent heroes that don't get acknowledged in the newspapers or on high achiever days, but we recognise their commitment, hard work and achievements and our staff are very proud of each of them.

Absences

This year at our System Leader's day we spent time discussing the importance of regular attendance. Simply put, in order for students to receive a quality learning experience and to be able to engage in their learning fully, they need to show up each and every day. Every day counts!

This year we have a College Attendance plan. Our goal in partnership with you is to have a consistent daily attendance rate over 90%. I am happy to report our rate today is 93%.

PASTORAL AND ADMINISTRATION

Year 7 Vaccinations

Each year NSW Health works with schools to offer the vaccines recommended for adolescents by the National Health and Medical Research Council (NHMRC).

The details of this year's vaccinations for Year 7 students are indicated below:

- Monday 13th March – 1st dose HPV + dTpa
- Monday 29th May – 2nd dose HPV + Varicella
- Monday 18th September – 3rd dose HPV

Parental/Guardian consent is required for students to be vaccinated. Consent forms will only be accepted if they are completed using black or blue pen and are original (photocopied or faxed forms will not be accepted).

Information packs will be distributed to students shortly and fact sheets have been appended to this newsletter.

I ask parents to complete the forms and return them to the school as soon as possible.

INNOVATIVE TEACHING AND LEARNING

A Year of Transformative Learning

2017 is planned to be a tremendous year for all members of our learning community, teachers, students and parents/caregivers. This year we go deeper into our already laid foundations set out in our Vision for Learning – with a clear focus for our learning being the building of skills, particularly Critical Thinking and Collaboration. Further to this, as teachers our learning will sharpen our skills of enquiry based learning, with this to be transferred into our lessons instilling amongst our students an approach that places creativity, questioning, problem solving and collaboration/communication at the heart of their learning experience. Literacy and Numeracy remain as key areas of teacher learning, focusing upon Reading/Comprehension across all subjects and Accountable talk in Mathematics. There will be various opportunities for parents/caregivers to attend various information and learning evenings to build strong school and parent partnerships.

To support their learning, students are asked to continue to develop strong relationships with their teachers and peers, to seek out answers to issues that may inhibit their learning. Students are strongly encouraged to make use of their College Diary, planning for assessments, setting learning goals, completing set homework etc. In the next week students will receive their Assessment Schedules. I ask that they place these dates in their diaries and work to ensure they understand the processes around misadventure, submission of tasks and malpractice.

HIGH ACHIEVER'S ASSEMBLY

On Wednesday 8th February we celebrated and acknowledged our Year 12 Graduates of 2016 who have excelled in the HSC. We celebrate with 16 students who have received an ATAR of 90 or above. The ATAR is the Australian Tertiary Admission Rank. All our students from the class of 2016 did exceptionally well and many more received an ATAR in the high 80's.

Our assembly is an opportune time for our current Year 12 students to reflect on the journey ahead in your final year of secondary education. I urge you to make the most of the opportunities. The often quoted phrase do your best, no regrets, has many facets – commitment, organisation, routines, research, practice, dialogue, enquiry and feedback. These attitudes are actions that impact deeply upon your learning. What is central is that learning is not simply an isolated and independent venture. Learning occurs through deep connections, this builds the necessary skills for further learning in the adult realm such as resilience, collaboration and diversity. Year 12 set your goals, set them high, set them now. In 11 months' time, the College will again send out an invitation for the high achievers next year to be our guest at our assembly.

To the students in Years 7 to 11, I put to you a challenge to make the most of your learning opportunities this year. Set goals, one being to obtain a Merit or Achievement certificate at the Semester One or Two Awards Assembly. Always have a positive attitude towards your learning, work with your teachers, work with your peers. Your learning is not simply about six or seven subject areas, its about transforming your minds and hearts. As a Catholic school we strive to form young people who truly believe and celebrate your dignity as made in God's image, who can transform the world around you – at home, amongst your friends or in society by being men and women of faith in the goodness and love. Challenge those structures that exclude, deny, demonise and belittle others especially the marginalised and most vulnerable in our society.




To commemorate this special anniversary, the Marist theme for this year is Awaken! Awaken is an invitation to really open our eyes, sharpen our senses and move with anticipation into our Marist future. To be grateful for the inspiring vision and life of Saint Marcellin Champagnat and his early brothers and to look to our Marist future and make Jesus Christ known and loved.





The 'Awaken' image shown speaks of our Christian story and of our deep desire to be in relationship with God and with one another. It celebrates the Bicentenary of our rich Marist spirituality, evoking the experiences of the first Marists and of those who have followed in their footsteps. The Awaken image can be broken down into three key elements:

Hands: – the hands represent our humanness and the work of God's creation. We use open hands in response to the story of the Gospel, indicating our willingness to respond to those most in need.

Heart: – As Marists, we place our absolute trust in God and depend on Mary for support and guidance. The heart or 'M', reminds us of our identity as Marists and speaks of our deep sense of family spirit that is strongly relational and affective. We strive together with a generous heart, constant and persevering in our daily work.

Spirit – The Holy Spirit in the image is represented by wind. Like the wind that appeared at Pentecost, we are reminded of the Spirit who continues to breathe life into our lives and the Church. Attentive to this Spirit, we are enthused and encouraged as it unveils the mystery of Christ, bringing us into deeper communion with God and into peace with one another.

NSW SCHOOL VACCINATION PROGRAM

Each year NSW Health works in partnership with schools to offer the vaccines recommended by the National Health and Medical Research Council (NHMRC) for adolescents as part of the School Vaccination Program.

In 2017 the following vaccines will be offered to Year 7 students:

- human papillomavirus (HPV) vaccine in a 3-dose schedule
- dTpa vaccine (Diphtheria, Tetanus & Pertussis (whooping cough)) as a single dose; and
- varicella vaccine (chickenpox) as a single dose.

Parent Information Kits that include an information sheet, consent form and privacy statement will be sent home to parents/guardians. To consent to the vaccination of their child, parents/guardians are advised to:

- read all the information provided
- complete the consent form, including signing their name next to each of the vaccines they would like their child to receive
- return the completed consent form to school
- ensure that their child eats breakfast on the day of the school vaccination clinic.

Parents/guardians who wish to withdraw their consent for any reason may do so by writing to the school Principal or phoning the school. The Procedure for Withdrawal of Consent is available on the NSW Health website at www.health.nsw.gov.au/immunisation.

To improve vaccination completion, students will be opportunistically offered any missed doses throughout the year where possible.

Please note that students who commence HPV vaccination in school clinics in Year 7 but do not complete the course during the school year will be offered catch-up doses at school in Year 8. Students who have any HPV doses at their GP will be advised to complete the course with their GP. We therefore encourage students to receive all doses of vaccines through the School Vaccination Program.

A Record of Vaccination will be provided to each student vaccinated at each clinic. Parents/guardians should ensure that this record is kept for future reference and should not assume that their child has been vaccinated if they do not receive this Record of Vaccination.




