From the Principal

Dear Parents. Staff. Students and Friends.

Last Sunday we celebrated the Solemnity of Pentecost, the birth of our Church, where the Holy Spirit was sent by the Risen Christ upon his Church. It is an opportunity to celebrate the Gift of the Holy Spirit, a time to be renewed, refreshed and revived. I think we can all agree that Pope Francis has brought a renewed, refreshed and revived way of thinking and being that invites us to connect deeply with the Jesus in our Gospels. He invites us; he challenges us as individuals, to step off the sidelines as Catholics and Christians and to engage on a personal level in bringing the presence of God into our world. How are we being inspired into action by the Holy Spirit? How can each of us bring happiness, peace and justice into our world, to others and to ourselves? In our busy lives we can sometimes forget the importance of prayer, of finding moments of quiet time to listen from within rather than the noise that surrounds us and sometimes consumes us completely in our contemporary world. I encourage each of us to find that time.

Last week, Year 12 received their reports and attended Parent Teacher Night. This night was a chance for our Year 12 students to get specific feedback about how to move forward, to build on the positives and identify blockers that maybe holding them back in achieving their goals. It is important to remember that, in reality, they have about 25% of their final HSC mark and therefore, there is time to make great improvements by working with relentless consistency, by doing practice questions and drafts of extended responses and by seeking and using descriptive feedback by their teachers. All senior students should be doing between 2 and 3 hours school work each night. Now is the time to commit, if you haven't already, there are no second chances. There is no better place than St Patrick's Marist if you are willing to do your best. The staff are committed and determined to help you get there. I remind parents and students of our study nights every Wednesday evening. It is a great way to focus individually, or work collaboratively with other students. I take this opportunity to thank the staff that give up their time each week to provide this time for our Year 12 students.

Last week, we like every other school completed the Naplan assessments. Much has been said about Naplan in the media. For our College, we see Naplan as the only form of data. It is one test on one day we use as a College, along with all of the other summative and formative assessments that occur throughout the year in helping to build a picture of our individual students and in recognising whole school patterns and specific literacy and numeracy skills we need to target. I thank our Director of Studies Ms Ellison and Mrs Van Zeeland from Administration for their organisation.

Thank you to everyone who attended our Mother's Day Liturgy. It was a wonderful way to celebrate the gift of our Mothers, Grandmothers and special women who fill those roles in our lives. I thank Mr Matthew Paton and Mrs Marie Donaghy for their organisation of such a special liturgy.

This week we have had our Athletics Carnival. I think we are all in a bit of shock that we haven't had to reschedule due to rain, in fact a beautiful, sunny 27 degrees. One of the greatest things about being a part of St Patrick's Marist is to see the way our students engage in whole school events and how well-mannered and responsive they are to staff on a day like the Athletics Carnival. Whether students were competing at the elite level or not, I was so pleased to see the level of enthusiasm and participation by all. I thank Ms Liska for her outstanding organisation, the students that came in early in the morning to set up the sound system and all of the teachers who contributed to the successful running of the day.

The new school, which is located in the rural village of Vizhalanmedu, opened its doors at the start of the new school year in mid-2015.

This year Jake has signed up with a Formula Ford Racing Car team called Listec Racing. At 14 years of age, he is currently the youngest racing car driver in Australia.


