From the Principal

Dear Parents, Staff, Students and Friends,

We come to the end of yet another extremely busy term and I thank all the staff and members of our community for their ongoing commitment and hard work.

Last week we held our College Musical 'Hairspray'. It was one of the best school musicals I have ever seen. It was a very professional, high energy and visually exciting spectacular. The discussion for the musical began back in Term 3 of 2016 and it has been full steam ahead since that moment. The performance involved over 100 students and showcased not only the talents of our performers, but the talent and skills of the many students that took other roles in music, sound and lighting, costuming, hair and makeup, set design, hospitality, painting, construction and the list go on. The quality and professionalism of the band consisting of our year 12 Music class, Kate Centrone (Year 12, 2016) and our Music teachers was outstanding and a tribute to their hard work and the many hours of preparation of a very difficult score.

The musical provides lasting memories for all involved; it builds new relationships across year groups, provides opportunities for students to showcase and develop talents and skills and they are just great fun to be a part of. A special thank you to the Performing Arts team, Mrs Renee Lyons (Director), Mrs Trudy Andrews (Music and Vocal Director), Ms Carmel Bonaventura (Stage Manager), Ms Jai Greenway (Technical Manager) and Mr Liam Heffernan (Vocal Director) and our visiting Choreographer Mrs Katrina Gooding. There were many staff and parents who assisted in the making of the musical so successful and I thank each and every one of them for the additional time they gave to support our students. It was wonderful to see ex-students Ashley Roberts and Nathan Taverniti supporting the musical.

In the middle of our Musical, the College hosted 9 debates for the Quarter Finals of the CSSA Debating. I thank Mrs Graham, Mrs Pett and Mr Moussa for their organisation and assistance. We welcomed 15 schools and I received wonderful feedback about our students who hosted the evening. I am very excited to share with you that our Senior Year 12 team were successful and will move to the Semi Finals next term.

In the last couple of weeks we also held the MCS Chess tournaments. The library was overflowing with students and there were some very intense fiercely contested chess games happening. I am very pleased to report that our Year 11 team won their division.

Recently Year 10 and 11 received their reports and attended their Parent / Student / Teacher night. This week, Years 7 and 8 will receive their reports and attend Parent / Student / Teacher interviews, followed by Year 9 in Week 1, Term 3. I was very impressed by the number of students with very positive feedback from their teachers. I hope that students who have worked diligently have been justly rewarded and I remind students that whatever has happened in the past does not determine their success in the future. We can learn from both positive and not so positive results, reflect and set new goals.

Recently our netballers attended the Australian Marist Netball Carnival in Sale. They were awarded Third Place in their division, which was a great result against a very strong and competitive field. Please note that the 2016 Yearbook has been delivered and was distributed to students in Years 8-12 on Wednesday. ATTENDANCE

A reminder to parents/carers that any student absence, whether partial or whole day, must be followed up within 7 school days with written advice, either via SMS or a hard copy in their diary.

As this is a legislative requirement, on Tuesday 13th June, the Catholic Education Diocese Parramatta implemented a new process in our system that automatically updates an attendance from an 'Absent' (awaiting written note) to an 'Unexplained Absence' (without receipt of an explanation within 7 school days). We ask that parents be vigilant in advising the College in writing of their child's non-attendance at school to avoid any 'Unexplained Absences' appearing on their student record.

AUSTRALIAN CATHOLIC YOUTH FESTIVAL

We'd like to invite you to consider attending the Australian Catholic Youth Festival (ACYF) which will be held in Sydney this December. The ACYF is a national gathering of over 20,000 young Catholic people from across Australia over three days from the 7th-9th December.

The Festival's theme is: **"Open New Horizons for Spreading Joy"** which draws inspiration from Pope Francis' address to young people at WYD Krakow 2016. ACYF will be the largest national Catholic youth event to be held in the history of the Church in Australia.

The cost for the three (3) days is \$250. This covers all meals, activities and transport to and from the venues at Homebush. In encouraging participation in these three days, the Parramatta Catholic Education Department and the school will cover almost two thirds of the cost. This will reduce the overall cost to \$100 per student.

Attached to this newsletter is a letter inviting senior students from Years 10 through to our current Year 12 to ACYF. The letter contains all relevant information and provides more scope on the initiative and specifics of the Festival.




Key Learning Areas

ENGLISH

ROMEO AND JULIET COMES TO LIFE





During the end of this term in English, Year 9 began to explore the concept of conflict through our study of the play "Romeo and Juliet", written by William Shakespeare. To help us in understanding the meaning and relevance of the play to our current time, the whole of Year 9 had the honour of watching a performance of Romeo and Juliet. Last week, on Tuesday the 20th of June, three talented actors from Young Australia Workshop arrived at the school and provided the grade with an entertaining and informative show, acting out key scenes from Shakespeare's play about how actors understand and memorise plays such as the one we are studying now.

The three visitors acted out the 'behind the scenes' of the actors who have to perform a play like Shakespeare's, and how they come to deal with both each other and the play. Afterwards, the three of them continued by performing two different scenes from the play - the sword fight between Romeo's best friend and Juliet's cousin, and the famous balcony scene between Romeo and Juliet. It was fantastic to see the scenes acted out.

Once they finished performing, they introduced themselves, and talked with us about the meaning of the play and how they memorise their lines as actors. Some students then asked questions before the performers chose five volunteers from the audience to stand up and shout Shakespearean insults at one of the guys from the company, encouraging them to use hand gestures and direct their anger towards him for effect. The students did this with full cooperation and gathered the attention of everyone in the grade, including the teachers.

Once finished, the volunteers went and sat back down, and the actors then showed us how most of the dialogue in the play matched with ten direct heart beats, showing us how Shakespeare used iambic pentameter, creating rhythm in the lines. They got us to clap along with them, and then split the grade in two. One half was to say a line from Romeo while he was speaking lovingly to Juliet, and the other half was to say a line from Romeo while he was speaking angrily during the fight, using threatening words and foul gestures. It became a competition, and the grade allocated Mr Bonora as the judge.

This incursion was overall a fun, interactive experience that assisted Year 9 in understanding Shakespeare's play. Young Australia Workshop provided the grade with a helpful way of experiencing Shakespeare today and made it very enjoyable and entertaining for everyone.

We'd like to invite you to consider attending the Australian Catholic Youth Festival (ACYF) to be held in Sydney this December.

The Australian Catholic Youth Festival (ACYF) is a national gathering of Catholic young people established by the Australian Catholic Bishops Conference (ACBC). It exists to provide young people with opportunities to deepen their relationship with Jesus, be empowered to be disciples in the world today and encounter and celebrate the vitality of the Church in Australia.

The Archdiocese of Sydney is hosting the event from December 7th-9th 2017 on behalf of the ACBC. The Festival receives collaborative support from the agencies of the Archdiocese, and greater Sydney dioceses of Broken Bay, Parramatta and Wollongong.

In December 2017 the Festival will launch the Year of Youth, celebrating ten years on from hosting World Youth Day 2008.

Purpose

The Australian Catholic Youth Festival exists to:

- Provide a high quality formative and experiential opportunity for young Catholics to encounter Jesus Christ, in the context of the Catholic Church in Australia;
- Listen to and discuss the issues and challenges in the lives of young Catholics in Australia;

- Provide young people with local examples and connections of vocations, social action, liturgy and prayer, catholic music and catechesis.


