From the Principal

This term has been jam packed with so many wonderful events and opportunities and I thank everyone here at the College for their hard work and commitment, and the many additional hours that our staff have contributed to ensure our students have the best possible experiences here at St Patrick's Marist.

Last week marked a most significant time for us as Christians as we remembered the events and circumstances of Jesus' suffering, death and resurrection. During last week, as we made our final preparations of prayer, fasting and alms giving we purposefully paused, taking time for deep reflection on our own lives and our response to Jesus' sacrifice. Our long journey to the font culminated in the three days that make up the Easter Triduum. These three days drew us into the mystery of our salvation. On Easter Sunday, we celebrated with joy in what God has done for us in his Son Jesus Christ. I thank Mr Paton, Mr Moussa and Mr Hornby for their organisation and our Year 7 students and the Social Justice group who were involved in our Easter Liturgy last Thursday.

On Good Friday, Mr Moussa and Mr Gabrael gathered with 13 of our students to walk 17.5 km from Blacktown (The Cathedral) to Parramatta Cathedral for the annual Good Friday walk, joining Bishop Vincent and Catholic Youth Parramatta, journeying overnight through six parishes in prayer, solidarity and reflection. I thank Mr Moussa for his wonderful support and the outstanding work he is doing with our Youth Ministry group.

Easter is a seven week season of joy and grace. Starting with the Triduum in Holy Week, and ending with Pentecost Sunday, this 50 day season has been called "the radiant centre of the liturgical year." We keep celebrating so that we might continue to enter into the meaning of the resurrection and to deepen the way it touches our daily lives.

Attendance and Reports:

As our school term comes to a close and Interim reports arrive, it is a good time for students to reflect on the goals that they set when meeting with Ms Hagarty and Mr Scanlon at the start of the year. Good results and satisfaction come from taking pride in our work, aiming high and being consistent each and every lesson, each and every day. Year 12 Examinations

Senior students are strongly encouraged to attend these if offered.

Interim Reports Years 7 to 11

Interim Reports will be mailed home at the end of next week which will provide an overview of your son/daughter's application, effort and engagement with each of their subjects this term. Please take time to discuss the results from these reports with your child and set term 2 goals to continue to build on the success of Term 1 and / or identify areas for growth and change.

Year 12 & 11 Parent Teacher Interviews

A reminder that Year 11 Parent Teacher interviews will be held on 8th May in the College Library. This provides a timely opportunity to meet your child's Preliminary teachers and seek feedback on their progress thus far. An emailed letter with booking details for interviews will be sent out this week.

Year 12 Parent Teacher interviews will be on 16th May in the College Library. Your son/daughter's reports will be sent home with them on 11th of May. This also provides a timely opportunity to meet your child's HSC teachers and seek feedback on their progress at this midway point of their courses. An emailed letter with booking details for interviews will be sent out next week.

Student Diaries

I ask that you assist your son/daughter to use their diary well. Parents are asked to sign the front of the diary accepting all policies contained in the diary. Good planning and organisation will greatly assist them in their learning. Please make

sure that you sign the diary each week; it is an excellent resource that, when utilised, will assist students with their learning.

Students need to get into the habit of writing down each subject for each period each day. Ideally this should be done on the weekend for the week ahead (highlight practical subjects that require students to bring equipment). Students are to write down homework when it is set and revision is to be undertaken when there is no set homework. Assignment due dates can also be placed in this section.

Use of Devices at Home

Technology is a normal part of our contemporary world and at school the use of technology is a tool to build the necessary skills of communication, collaboration and creativity. However, can I remind parents and caregivers that students can use their workbooks to complete homework, hand written work that is neat is also encouraged. We also encourage our students to be visible in the home environment when using their devices or to use the family device rather than their personal one. The College only uses the Google Platform (Google Classroom, Doc, Slides etc) which all students can access through any device at home. Your supervision and support when students are completing tasks at home is recommended.

Key Learning

SCIENCE

Year 11 Earth and Environmental Science

On Friday, 9th March, a group of fifteen Year 11 Earth and Environmental Science students accompanied by Ms Szaycz and Ms botto, carried out a field study in the area of Carlingford and Dundas Valley. The excursion encompassed the topic and skills that we have een studying in the first weeks of term, focussing on the geological history of the Sydney Basin. At the start of the excursion, we walked from St Patrick's Marist to Telopea shops where we caught the bus to the top of Carlingford. From here, we worked our way through the Pond's Walk, down to Sir Mitchell Thomas reserve in Dundas Valley. Throughout the day, we stopped at six different



locations, where each pair of students had the chance to take soil samples, identify the soil type, test the pH of the samples and test the water from various creeks and ponds. Each pair carried a kit thoughout the day that contained all of the necessary equipment needed to carry out hands-on soil and water testing. The kit included a pH testing kit, sample jars and charts. We also collected extra samples that we took back to the laboratory for further testing. Our last stop on the excursion, which is the subject of our depth study, was at Sir Thomas Mitchell reserve. This area was the location of the Dundas Quarry, where a volcanic intrusion, 40 metres deep was present over 235 million years ago. We were able to see the remains of the site, and collect samples of 'blue metal', a type of igneous rock.

This excursion supplied all of the students who attended with a deeper understanding of the hands-on components of Earth and Environmental Science. Being given the opportunity to carry out the sample testing was a great experience that allowed us to see how our local area was formed. Personally, I found the excursion especially interesting to see how the skills we discuss during class are put to use in the real world. This excursion was an experience that we will all be able to carry through into Year 12 and in our further studies.
